OLD/NEW BUSINESS:

Burgess Fire District. Mr. Barnard requested that the Public Safety Committee look at offering a special fire district and millage option to provide fulltime employees to man a station in the Burgess area.

<u>Golf Cart Beach Parking.</u> Mr. Lazarus stated there was a problem with parked golf carts being towed. He, Mr. Gosnell and Mr. Whitten would be assessing the Shore Drive area in the coming week and would come to Council and the I&R Committee with recommendations on how to handle the problem.

<u>Cricket Cove Litigation.</u> Mr. Weaver stated there were two lawsuits pending in the Horry County Court of Common Pleas. One was Cricket Cove v/s Horry County and County Council as a whole, and the other was Cricket Cove v/s Mr. Worley, Chairman Gilland and others unnamed. He was not speaking on the individual lawsuit against Mr. Worley and Chairman Gilland and the unnamed persons, but was speaking on the one against the County as a whole. On September 26, 2006 Judge Breeden issued an order dismissing in full the lawsuit against the County.
