# MINUTES HORRY COUNTY COUNCIL REGULAR MEETING November 28, 2006 6:00 p.m.

Second reading and public review of <u>Ordinance 224-06</u> to amend several prior ordinances associated with Time Warner-Advance/Newhouse Partnership's ownership and operation of various cable television franchises in Horry County. Mr. Lazarus moved to approve, seconded by Mr. Worley. Kathy Babson, Time Warner, spoke briefly. Mr. Lazarus requested that Time Warner look into adding a channel for the School District. The motion passed unanimously.

Second reading and public review of <u>Ordinance 225-06</u> to amend Ordinance 20-85 associated with Horry Telephone Cooperative's ownership and operation of a cable television franchise in Horry County. Mr. Worley moved to approve, seconded by Mr. Prince. There was no public review. Mr. Worley moved to amend to add in Paragraph Six the following wording: "Nothing in this section shall be construed to obligate the service provider to provide free service to a school or college facility that may be serving as a dormitory", seconded by Mr. Lazarus.
